FOUNDATION 2020 GIVING OVERVIEW

As the charitable and philanthropic arm of Motorola Solutions, the Motorola Solutions Foundation is one of the many ways in which the company lives out its purpose to help people be their best in the moments that matter.

The Foundation, which has donated \$100 million over the last 10 years, partners with organizations that align to our purpose, strategic giving priorities and values, which include accountability, innovation, impact, diversity and inclusion. Within our annual grants program, we focus our giving in three key areas:

- STEM education, specifically focused on technology and engineering
- First responder programming
- Blended first responder programming and technology and engineering education programs

Additionally, we believe that providing opportunity amongst underserved communities helps to advance creativity, drive productivity and inspire new ways of thinking. We have a long-standing commitment to supporting programs that benefit underrepresented populations, including females, people of color, people with disabilities, the LGBTQ community, veterans and others. In fact, in 2020, the majority of our grant funding directly benefited people of color, including students, teachers and first responders. Within our technology and engineering program grants, 62% of funding directly supported females.

CANADA

ACTUA

The National Girls Program (NGP) provides over 10,000 girls, ages 6-16, with hands-on skill development programming which implements their ideas, interests, and addresses barriers that limit inclusion in STEM fields. Additionally, this project educates girls in digital citizenship to help foster and create a safer online community.

ACTUA*

The COVID-19 Relief program adapts STEM and digital skills programs and resources to support at-home learning, reaching thousands of students throughout the period of COVID-related school closures. The program supports teachers, parents and caregivers in engaging K-12 youth in quality, at-home STEM learning aligned to the provincial curriculum, helping youth achieve their STEM learning objectives in fields.

ALBERTA CRITICAL INCIDENT ADVISORY COUNCIL*

The ICISF-Canada and COVID-19 Specific Programming establishes an online platform for peer support and trainings for first responders to be utilized throughout the pandemic. ICISF-Canada provides resources, material and training so that all Canadian first responders are able to access a peer network at all times.

CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF FIRE CHIEFS

Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs (CAFC) supports women in succeeding within a fire service initiative by identifying strong female fire leaders and engaging them in a mentorship program. The program trains the future leaders in best practices and overall leadership development.

CANADIAN FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS FOUNDATION

Canadian Fallen Firefighters Foundation (CFFF) provides scholarships for children and spouses of fallen firefighters. The CFFF awards four to six four-year scholarships annually, with the ultimate goal of providing educational assistance to every child of a fallen firefighter.







CANADIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY

The Canadian Red Cross Missing Maps initiative creates digital maps of Canada's 'underrepresented' places to help local first responders and humanitarian agencies better respond to crises affecting specific areas. The Missing Maps initiative facilitates the assessment, study and documentation of areas with inadequate maps, supporting populations vulnerable to potential risks.

CPKN NETWORK, INC.

CPKN partners with the Canadian police community and representatives from the Indigenous community to develop and deliver a blended Indigenous Awareness program for the Canadian Law Enforcement community through online learning, classroom resources, webinars and discussion groups. The course informs law enforcement on cultural awareness, current issues and trends, and develops cultural competencies and an understanding of cultural differences within the Canadian Indigenous community.

HUMBER COLLEGE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY & ADVANCED LEARNING

The Motorola Solutions Foundation Inclusivity Scholarships for First Responders supports ten students from traditionally underrepresented groups in the police, paramedic and pre-service firefighter programs. The scholarships lead to stronger diversity in the ranks and leadership of Toronto-area emergency services.

PROACTION COPS & KIDS

The Neighborhood Officer program engages police officers with core competencies in community engagement to lead skill-building programs. The officers engage with over 300 youth who live in communities known for violence, crime, drug and gang activity. The program provides a safe, fun way for officers to become engaged and accepted members of these neighborhoods.

UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA

The Summer Research Program engages female and non-binary high school students through a six week placement in the University of Alberta's STEM labs. Students from across Alberta, Canada will participate in real-life research as paid research assistants, with projects focusing on engineering and technology.

UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA*

The Creation of a Local and Distributed Manufacturing Network seeks to address the needs of personal protective equipment (PPE) in the short and medium term, creating the tools necessary for injection molding to produce and deliver 20,000 face shields to front-line healthcare workers, longterm care facilities, clinics, laboratories, pharmacies and other essential services in Alberta.

RYERSON UNIVERSITY

The Global Changemaker Engineering Competition welcomes highly motivated female students, grades 7-8, to explore engineering and its social impact at the university level via a weekend-long summit. Students explore life as an engineer, with a focus on the global and societal implications of engineering.

RYERSON UNIVERSITY*

The Online Outreach Tool provides students, teachers and parents an online self-paced learning module and live virtual learning sessions with a focus on engineering concepts. The tool will make STEM accessible for underserved students through activities, courses and events catered to grades 3-12, as well as resources for parents and teachers to help students navigate the activities and learning outcomes.





UNITED STATES

NATIONWIDE

AMERICAN FEDERATION OF POLICE & CONCERNED CITIZENS, INC.*

American Federation of Police & Concerned Citizens supports families following a law enforcement line-of-duty death. The organization predominantly focuses on the children of fallen officers through services such as a gift program, college scholarship support, summer camps and grief counseling. Additionally, the Federation provides support to families of law enforcement officers who have experienced a line-of-duty death as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

AMERICAN INDIAN SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING SOCIETY (AISES)

AISES increases awareness and interest in STEM and computer science (STEM+C) among American Indian K-12 students by engaging them in hands-on STEM activities powered by Sphero technology. Over 150 students learn the principles of the scientific method and computer science using cutting-edge technology with real-world applications.



AMERICAN RED CROSS

The Home Fire Campaign aims to reduce the number of fire deaths and injuries in the United States by distributing, installing and testing smoke alarms in at-risk communities. The program engages youth in fire-prevention and preparedness information as well as sharing vital information with the communities they serve through marketing and public relations outreach.

ARMED FORCES MISSION, INC.

The Intervene Challenge program aims to eradicate suicide in the communities they serve by providing the first responder community with world class training in suicide intervention and mental health first aid. The Intervene Challenge provides participants of evidenced informed training that is proven to reduce the risk of suicide. Participants gain the skills and confidence to render aid to individuals at risk of suicide through 15 powerful learning objectives.

ASSOCIATION OF PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS OFFICIALS INTERNATIONAL, INCORPORATED (APCO)

The Commercial Advisory Council & Silent Key Scholarship Program provides the opportunity for public-safety communications professionals, primarily women, to participate in industry-leading certification training programs and professional development courses to better serve their communities and first responders.

ASSOCIATION OF THE GRADUATES OF THE UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY

The Center for Leadership & Diversity in STEM provides a comprehensive program, extending from elementary school through professional levels, seeking to build an overall stronger and more diverse national STEM pipeline. The program reaches 2,000 students through hands-on mobile STEM workshops taught in high-need locations nationwide, and more than 50 STEM professionals through lectures and conferences with diverse experts and mentors.





BLUE H.E.L.P., INC.

Camp April is a bereavement camp exclusively for children of law enforcement officers whose parents died by suicide. The camp mixes traditional camp fun and camaraderie with customized grief education and emotional support delivered by trained professionals and caring volunteers.

BORDER PATROL FOUNDATION

The Scholars Program provides graduating high school seniors of fallen Border Patrol Agents scholarships to continue their education. Each year BPF awards scholarships nationwide, with first funding priority going to the surviving children.

CODE.ORG

Code.org's Professional Learning Program is a five day workshop for teachers across the U.S to train on how to integrate coding in the course curriculum. The workshop is followed by four 1-day workshops to support teachers as they implement the coding curriculum. Over 52,000 students and teachers are served by the program.

CONCERNS OF POLICE SURVIVORS (C.O.P.S.)

C.O.P.S. Parents Retreat helps parents of fallen officers resolve individual and family grief issues through grief seminar sessions, peer support events, and participation in challenging and fun outdoor activities to build self-esteem. Over the last ten years, the Parents Retreat year has aided surviving parents who are beginning or continuing their grief journey after their tragic loss of a child.

The C.O.P.S. Scholarship Program provides financial scholarship support to surviving children and spouses of law enforcement officers who were killed in the line of duty.

DEA SURVIVORS BENEFIT FUND, INC.

The DEA Survivors Benefit Fund provides education and benefits to family members of DEA employees and deputized Task Force Officers within 24 hours of death in the line of duty. The program serves over 12,500 families.

DENISE AMBER LEE FOUNDATION INC.

The Denise Amber Lee Foundation's Public Safety Education Program inspires thousands of communications personnel and first responders with quality full day training classes. The Denise Amber Lee Foundation continues to lend its tragedy and voice to the quest for uniform training of all telecommunicators taking and dispatching 9-1-1 calls nationwide.

DESTINATION IMAGINATION, INC.

The Preparing Students from Under-Served Communities for the Future of Work using STEM Challenges provides financial and educational support for more than 175 middle and high school students from low-income areas. Teams participate in STEM challenges, requiring students to work collaboratively while using design thinking and the creative process to solve an open-ended STEM based challenge with a science focus.

EPICS K12

The EPICS K12 program uses a regional cluster model to introduce, support and sustain community-based service-learning projects in schools. This model enables EPICS to engage more than 4,000 middle and high school students in human-centered design projects within their own communities, impacting thousands of community members in 17 states and Washington D.C.





FBI NATIONAL ACADEMY ASSOCIATES, INC.

FBI National Academy Associates programming provides resources to law enforcement agencies that are designed to assist in the development of resiliency, as well as the development of solutions to systemic concerns about the wellness of our officers and their families. The course focuses on four main domains: mental, physical, spiritual and social.

FBIAA MEMORIAL COLLEGE FUND

The scholarship program provides educational scholarships toward 2- or 4-year degrees for qualified students whose deceased parent was an active FBI agent. Students throughout the world are eligible to apply.

FIRST RESPONDER CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE FOR REDUCING OCCUPATIONAL ILLNESS, INJURIES, AND DEATHS (FRCE)

FRCE hosts two-day Regional Fire Service Health & Wellness Seminars across the United States to review occupational health risks, occupational cancers, cardiovascular events and behavioral health injuries and share recommendations on how to manage and reduce these risks.

FIRST RESPONDER CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE FOR REDUCING OCCUPATIONAL ILLNESS, INJURIES, AND DEATHS (FRCE)*

The Stress First Aid Training Module assists first responders and healthcare workers in dealing with stress and trauma related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The modules provide relevant and actionable information that can be used by first responders and healthcare workers and shared with members of his or her department or organization to advance the occupational health agenda and ensure our first responders recover from the effects of COVID-19.

FOR INSPIRATION AND RECOGNITION OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (FIRST)

First is a robust multi-age robotics program that provides over 1,000 students (teams receiving direct team grants) with hands-on opportunities

to apply math and science concepts to design, build, test and compete with robots at FIRST events globally. Motorola Solutions Foundation directly supports Motorola Solutions-led robotics teams, as well as scholarship funds for diverse and under resourced teams.

INSTITUTE FOR VETERANS AND MILITARY FAMILIES AT SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY

The Onward to Opportunity (020) program is a twelve-month educational program for transitioning active duty service members, veterans and military spouses. The program is delivered on military bases and online with 50+ predefined information technology, business management and customer service learning pathways to help participants obtain the knowledge and certifications essential to meet labor market needs.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FIRE CHIEFS

The Fire Service Executive Development Institute (FSEDI) is a year-long program that prepares a selected group of aspiring and new fire-EMS chiefs to have successful tenures by enhancing their leadership skills. Members of the program are also provided with avenues to get actively involved with national professional organizations.volunteers.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FIRE CHIEFS (IAFC) FOUNDATION

The regional Company Officer Leadership Symposium is a three-day instructional program designed to meet the specific leadership and training needs of company officers, captains and lieutenants, based on their roles and responsibilities. The program meets the necessary Job Performance Requirements (JPRs) as defined in NFPA 1021 and follows officer development standards identified in the IAFC's Officer Development Handbook.





INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE (IACP)

The Law Enforcement Family Support Training and Technical Assistance Program helps agencies develop and enhance family support programs with the goal of improving officer safety and wellness. Policing leaders and stakeholders receive training from subject matter experts that offer guidance and insight on enhancing family support efforts.

MAJOR CITIES CHIEFS ASSOCIATION

The Police Executive Leadership Institute (PELI) is a leadership development program for assistant and deputy chief levels of major cities. It includes two four-day classroom sessions, a comprehensive evaluation, an interactive case study challenge, and a three day visit with a mentor. Participants are exposed and collaborate with experienced chiefs who candidly share challenges, successes and failures.

MAJOR COUNTY SHERIFFS OF AMERICA FOUNDATION

FRCE hosts two-day Regional Fire Service Health & Wellness Seminars across the United States to review occupational health risks, occupational cancers, cardiovascular events and behavioral health injuries and share recommendations on how to manage and reduce these risks.

MATE INSPIRATION FOR INNOVATION

The MATE International ROV (underwater robot) Competition challenges students to learn and creatively apply STEM skills to solve real-world problems and strengthen their critical thinking, collaboration, entrepreneurship and innovation. Each spring, thousands of middle and high school students engineer ROVs and prepare technical reports, posters and presentations to participate in regional events that take place around the world and feed into a world championship.

MOVEMENT FORWARD, INC.

The National Faith & Blue Weekend brings together tens of thousands of law enforcement officers with community residents and a diverse group of faith

leaders for activities across the country to advocate justice, ease tensions, build relationships and improve public safety. The activities, ranging from cookouts to panel discussions, aim to facilitate meaningful connections between law enforcement and the public, building bridges to safer communities.

THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN LAW ENFORCEMENT EXECUTIVES (NAWLEE)

NAWLEE provides a mentoring program to support women entering the law enforcement field and those who are progressing through their careers. Mentoring has been shown to create a more engaged workforce, achieve higher rates of retention, improve job satisfaction, enhance wellness and safety. Trainers will train 30-40 mentors and match them with mentees.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION TO PROTECT CHILDREN

The H.E.R.O. Child-Rescue Corps puts America's wounded, ill and injured service members on a new battlefield with a noble new mission: protecting children from exploitation and abuse. The program trains veterans and transitioning service members in counter-child-exploitation and digital forensics, and then embeds them with law enforcement. Graduates are in high demand by law enforcement and the private sector.

NATIONAL CENTER FOR THE PREVENTION OF COMMUNITY VIOLENCE*

The First Responder Wellness COVID-19 Response Program (CRP) uses an innovative approach to providing comprehensive, culturally competent training, education and tools to foster health and wellness of public safety personnel and their families. This provides our nation's first responders and families confidential, anonymous access to culturally competent, cutting edge health/wellness information and resources. Fifteen public safety agencies will receive scholarships to participate in the program at no-cost.







NATIONAL EMERGENCY NUMBER ASSOCIATION (NENA)

NENA's #ThankYou911 Scholarship Program provides financial assistance for our nation's 9-1-1 first responders so they can participate in professional development classes & training. The scholarship program supports dispatch workers to be the best trained and most well-equipped in order to effectively and efficiently respond to the citizens of this country when they are in the greatest need.



NATIONAL ENGINEERS WEEK FOUNDATION DBA DISCOVERE

DiscoverE takes a holistic and collaborative approach to spark girls' active interest in education and technology careers, and supports women engaged in a technology and engineering career pathways through the following programs: Introduce a Girl to an Engineer Day, the Global Marathon for, by, and about Women in Engineering, and the Future City Competition.

In honor of International Women's Day, DiscoverE conducts a variety of programs that inspire present and future generations to discover engineering, specifically targeted at engaging girls and women.

NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS FOUNDATION (NFFF)

NFFF's scholarship program provides educational scholarships to the children, stepchildren, partners, and spouses of fallen firefighters during the 2021-2022 academic year. Awards are based on financial need and academic achievement, including two or more full scholarships for Public Safety or STEM students attending four year accredited institutions. Remaining funds support eligible students enrolled in 2 or 4-year accredited institutions or vocational/technical training certification programs.

NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT MEMORIAL FUND

National Police Week is a collaborative effort of many organizations dedicated to honoring America's law enforcement community. Families of fallen officers, law enforcement leadership, citizens and more convene to pay their respect to those who gave the ultimate sacrifice during a candlelight vigil.

NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF BLACK LAW ENFORCEMENT EXECUTIVES (NOBLE)

The Law and Your Community is a nationally recognized hands-on interactive training program for young people ages 13-18 and adults, designed to improve their communications with law enforcement officers and their understanding of their federal, state and local laws. The program serves over 10,000 youth and adults annually.

NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF GAY AND LESBIAN SCIENTISTS AND TECHNICAL PROFESSIONALS, INC. (NOGLSTP)

NOGLSTP offers scholarships and mentoring for LGBTQ students studying STEM in undergraduate and graduate studies as well as provides online mentoring through affiliation with MentorNet. The NOGLSTP-MentorNet partnership provides opportunities for college students to seek advice and mentorship from other LGTBQ professionals who currently work in a STEM field.





NATIONAL VOLUNTEER FIRE COUNCIL, INC.

The Volunteer Firefighter Health and Safety Training Initiative prepares first responders to safely and efficiently serve their communities nationwide. Through online and in person courses, volunteers across the US will receive free training on critical health and safety topics.

PHOENIX SOCIETY, INC.

The Phoenix World Burn Congress is an annual, international conference that brings together 1,000 burn survivors, their families, caregivers, burn care professionals and firefighters. This event is a reflection of the burn community in action. Participants come together to offer support, increase knowledge of burn recovery and share inspiring stories.



POLICE EXECUTIVE RESEARCH FORUM

POLICE EXECUTIVE RESEARCH FORUM (PERF)

Through Critical Issues in Policing 2020-2021, PERF addresses the challenges most pressing to the policing profession by conducting research, convening national forums and publishing reports highlighting promising practices. Police professionals nationwide, including PERF's 3,000 members, have access to the published resources. PERF will also share its findings with other stakeholders and through news and social media outlets to ensure a greater dissemination.



RIT ROCHESTER INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY


Rochester Institute of Technology provides students the opportunity to experience age appropriate STEM related activities taught by deaf and hard of hearing faculty and staff. By removing language and cultural barriers, as well as social stigmas often attached to students who are deaf and hard of hearing, children have the opportunity to explore the possibilities of a college education and STEM related careers.



SANDY HOOK PROMISE FOUNDATION

The National Know the Signs Expansion Initiative empowers 4.25 million youth and adults to recognize potential signs of violence before it happens by providing free educational programming, and will establish an additional 1,850 student-led SAVE Promise Clubs to embed and sustain these programs in schools. Each program is evidence-based/evidence-informed and delivered at no cost to schools and youth organizations nationwide.

SCIENCE BUDDIES

Science Buddies develops videos and lesson plans for middle school educators which enable teachers with no previous engineering experience to teach engineering confidently and well. These engineering education resources will be distributed online for free nationwide and are expected to be used by 500 teachers with 30,000 students in the first year alone.

SOCIETY OF WOMEN ENGINEERS

The SWENext High School Leadership Academy provides leadership for female high school students. In addition to in-person programming at SWE's Annual Conference, WE20, participants will engage in year-round leadership activities.

The Motorola Solutions Foundation Engineering Scholarship provides financial assistance to women admitted to accredited baccalaureate or graduate programs, in preparation for careers in engineering, engineering technology and computer science. The scholarship, which supports ten female engineering students, prioritizes underrepresented populations as well as students demonstrating financial need.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS

The Train the Trainer program builds capacity, skills and understanding to law enforcement and first responders by utilizing proven methods of teaching on how to serve people with intellectual disabilities in their communities. Special Olympics aims to improve law enforcement officers' ability to communicate and serve people with intellectual disabilities, ultimately helping create safer and more inclusive communities.

THE EDUCATOR'S SCHOOL SAFETY NETWORK

The All-Hazards School Safety Professional Development Workshops assist school leaders and school safety team members in crisis response and violence prevention. Additionally, the program aims to instill in participants a comprehensive school safety perspective based in research/best practices, as well as a focused educational perspective to meet the

unique needs of a school setting and develop the skills and capacities that educators must have to appropriately prevent and respond to crisis events.

THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR MISSING & EXPLOITED CHILDREN (NCMEC)

NCMEC is committed to providing training to law enforcement and other child-serving professionals on issues of missing children and child sexual exploitation. Training provided helps law enforcement participants to stay current on the dynamics of crimes committed against children; how to respond to child abduction, exploitation, and sex trafficking cases; and shares the resources available to them




THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF BLACK ENGINEERS (NSBE)

The Motorola Solutions Foundation NSBE scholarships supports students of color obtaining an undergraduate degree in an engineering field. NSBE envisions a world in which engineering is a mainstream word in homes and communities of color, and all Black students can envision themselves as engineers. In this world, Blacks exceed parity in entering engineering fields, earning degrees, and succeeding professionally.







THE WASHINGTON CENTER FOR INTERNSHIPS AND ACADEMIC SEMINARS

The Motorola Solutions Foundation Scholars program supports college students in completing training and internship experiences in law enforcement and criminal justice roles. The program engages students with top practitioners for a full semester, addresses key policy, technology and social issues around public safety and provides professional development training to prepare a diverse group of young men and women to lead in public safety organizations across our nation.

ARIZONA

PHOENIX POLICE FOUNDATION

The Phoenix Police Cadet Program provides young adults with leadership skills and law enforcement training and experience, with an emphasis on the importance of community relationships. The Cadet program accepts 60 to 100 young men and women annually.

CALIFORNIA

AMERICAN NATIONAL RED CROSS

Prepare SoCal trains the public on disaster preparedness and post-event recovery in Southern California, focused on natural and weather related disasters. Preparedness initiatives increase the public's knowledge of disasters and enable communities to respond effectively should disaster strike.

ANNIECANNONS, INC.

The From Survivor to Software Developer: Tech Education to Fight Human Trafficking program gives survivors of human trafficking a chance to learn

critical skills to enter the technology industry and build out real software solutions to fight human trafficking and other issues relating to gender-based violence

CAL POLY POMONA FOUNDATION, INC.

The Creating Wearable Gadgets through Programming and Soldering will engage 30 middle school and high school girls in Riverside County, CA. Students will engage in hands-on activities by designing and creating wearable gadgets using conductive thread for electrical circuits and learning to solder.

LOS ANGELES FIRE DEPARTMENT FOUNDATION

Los Angeles Fire Department youth programs serve more than 1,000 students between the ages of 14 and 22. With Cadet posts throughout the city, four youth FIRE Academies, four annual Girls Camps and three magnet high schools, programs are readily accessible in every part of the city. The programs prepare students for fire service careers and provide valuable life skills for whatever educational or career path they choose.

LOS ANGELES FIRE DEPARTMENT FOUNDATION*

LAFD Foundation's COVID-19 Response Fund equips LAFD Youth Program participants with personal protective equipment (PPE) to slow the spread of COVID-19. The Fund also provides financial support for 286 civilian LAFD members and their families experiencing financial hardship as a result of the pandemic.

LOS ANGELES POLICE FOUNDATION

The Conflict Resolution Training for Law Enforcement trains 80 Los Angeles Police Department supervisors (sworn and civilian) how to identify and manage conflict in the workplace in the City of Los Angeles.





LOS ANGELES POLICE FOUNDATION*

The LAPD COVID-19 Relief and Response fund supports 13,000 Los Angeles police officers and their families by providing personal protective equipment (PPE) and sanitizing supplies through the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic. By ensuring officers have access to PPE and sanitization, officers can keep communities safe and support efforts to slow the spread of the coronavirus.

SAN DIEGO POLICE FOUNDATION

The SafetyNet: Smart Cyber Choices® is a joint public safety and technology education program of the Police Foundation and the San Diego Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (SD-ICAC). The program keeps kids safe online by increasing internet safety awareness for school aged children, educators, parents and community leaders.



URBAN TXT: TEENS EXPLORING TECHNOLOGY

The Summer Coding Leadership Academy (SCLA) immerses low-income, young men of color in an intensive 10-week computer science and entrepreneurship curriculum that helps to end the school-to-prison pipeline in South Los Angeles. SCLA students learn through the process of ideating, designing, and coding applications how to solve problems in their community.



WORKSHOPS FOR WARRIORS, INC.

The Machining for Warriors program is an accelerated program of study that culminates in industry-recognized advanced manufacturing SolidWorks machining credentials. Veterans graduating from the program are placed in established, high demand jobs in the advanced manufacturing industry.

COLORADO

GIRLS INCORPORATED OF METRO DENVER

The Girls Inc. Eureka! program is an intensive, five-year STEM based program that builds girls' confidence and skills through hands-on opportunities in STEM. Utilizing a "whole girl" approach, the program also incorporates sports and physical fitness, personal development and college and career readiness.

METROPOLITAN STATE UNIVERSITY OF DENVER FOUNDATION, INC.*

The Rapid COVID-19 Antibody Testing Program for the Auraria Campus Community ensures the safety of more than 40,000 students, faculty, and staff as they return to classes and offices and help prevent an outbreak of COVID-19 on campus.

FLORIDA

AMERICAN RED CROSS

The Home Fire Campaign aims to reduce the number of fire deaths and injuries in the United States by distributing, installing and testing smoke alarms in at-risk communities. The program engages youth in fire-prevention and preparedness information as well as sharing vital information with the communities they serve through marketing and public relations outreach.





CONSORTIUM OF FLORIDA EDUCATION FOUNDATIONS

The Motorola STEM Solutions for Florida's Future program consists of nine projects throughout Florida, each directly involving a minimum of 100 middle and high school students. Events and activities are facilitated throughout the year to enhance academic success and also provide students with continuous exposure to the computer science and engineering profession.



FLORIDA SHERIFFS ASSOCIATION*

The Critical Supplies Working Group helps locate alternative supply lines for personal protective equipment (PPE) and other essential items needed for sheriff's offices during this outbreak. The workgroup shares information with and among the 67 sheriff's offices in Florida. The working group exchanges best practices for locating supply, supports vetting of suppliers (given the extraordinary demand and increased fraudulent activity occurring within the PPE supply chain), and shares methods that have been used to reduce the threat of COVID-19 in jails.

GREAT MINDS IN STEM (GMIS)

The 100 Club Educational Assistance Program provides post-secondary scholarships to dependents of fallen

first responders from Cook, Lake and McHenry County, Illinois.







100 CLUB OF CHICAGO*

The 100 Club of Chicago First Response Aid COVID program provides financial assistance to families who have lost a first responder in the line of duty due to COVID-19 related health issues.

ADLER PLANETARIUM*

Adler Planetarium's COVID-19 response programming engages staff and volunteers to produce personal protective equipment using 3-D printing technology, volunteering their computing technologies to advance urgent virology research, promoting the importance of social distancing and engaging students (and explorers of all ages) in remote science activities.

AFTER SCHOOL MATTERS, INC.

The Audio Electronic Designs program is a STEM apprenticeship that offers high school teens, ages 14-19, an immersive introduction to audio and electrical engineering. Through collaborative hands-on projects, such as building a ribbon microphone, teens develop knowledge and gain skills within the fields of electronic and acoustical engineering while preparing for post-secondary success.

AFTER SCHOOL MATTERS, INC.*

After School Matters' Summer Virtual Program aims to close the technology gap (devices and internet access), address food insecurity and continue to provide stipends through their summer programming in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

AMERICAN RED CROSS

The Home Fire Campaign aims to reduce the number of fire deaths and injuries in the United States by distributing, installing and testing smoke alarms in at-risk communities. The program engages youth in fire-prevention and preparedness information as well as sharing vital information with the communities they serve through marketing and public relations outreach.

ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE

The Anti-Defamation League's (ADL) Managing Implicit Bias, Hate Crimes, and Extremism for Law Enforcement training introduces 4,000 Chicago Police Department officers to a series of practical, actionable strategies for managing the impact of implicit bias that are uniquely designed for law enforcement professionals. The training will impact upwards of 12,000 law enforcement personnel in the Midwest and contribute to improved police-community relations and safer policing practices.

BIG BROTHERS/BIG SISTERS OF METROPOLITAN CHICAGO

Bigs in Blue matches 50 youth with law enforcement officers in a mentor pair. Youth and officers are encouraged to meet 2-4 times a month, with the aim of exposing youth to careers in law enforcement, while simultaneously building trust and relationships between communities and law enforcement.

BIG BROTHERS/BIG SISTERS OF METROPOLITAN CHICAGO*

Big Brothers/Big Sisters Family Response Fund supports first responders and front-line healthcare workers and their families who participate as mentors or mentees in BBBS's programming. The fund provides financial assistance grants to meet their basic needs through the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic, including but not limited to technology, food, medicine, utilities and rent.

BIG SHOULDERS FUND

STEM Extended Day aims to inspire interest and confidence in STEM skills and concepts among underserved students in Big Shoulders Fund schools through exposure to high-quality curricula, technology and resources during out-of-school hours. Extended Day allows students to set the course for exploration of STEM subjects including coding engineering, computer sciences and robotics.





CHICAGO TECH ACADEMY

The ChiTech STEM Scholarship Program provides graduating seniors (100) & alumni (100) with scholarships to pursue STEM-related majors in college. This program allows ChiTech to implement disruptive & systemic change in the STEM industry, specifically around increasing the pipeline of women and individuals of color.

CHICAGO POLICE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION

The Suicide Prevention and Officer Wellness seminar showcases top mental health & law enforcement experts from across the country to speak to the officers, with the goal of decreasing officer suicides and increasing knowledge and awareness of mental health resources. The seminar engages officers in supervisory roles to give them the necessary tools to support their direct reports in times of need and crisis. Annually, the seminar reaches capacity at 300 participants from the Chicago Police Department and surrounding municipalities.

CHICAGO PRE-COLLEGE SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING PROGRAM, INC. (CHIS&E)

ChiS&E provides hands-on out-of-school science, math and engineering activities to 7th-10th grade students in Chicago's low-income African American and Latino communities. Participants explore computer architecture through Raspberry Pi, and design robots using the Engineering Design Process.

CHICAGO YOUTH CENTERS

Chicago Youth Center's (CYC) Maker Labs offer project-based opportunities for students to learn how to code, manipulate vectors and use a 3-D printer, as well as develop valuable skills in metalworking, robotics and electrical engineering as they follow a project from idea to product. At the end of each program session, students participate in a culminating event where they present their work to their families and community members.

CODE NATION

Code Nation teaches youth industry-relevant programming languages, provides authentic work experiences, and develops soft skills like problem solving and collaboration. Code Nation's multi-year program begins with an in-school coding course, the Intro to Web Development (IWD), followed by a two-year advanced coding course, the Coding Fellowship, which takes place onsite at our company partners' offices.

CODE PLATOON

Code Platoon transforms veterans into professional software developers through an immersive and educational program that employs hands-on, in-person training with each group to learn software design principles, modern software languages and best practices. in-person training with each group to learn software design principles, modern software languages and best practices.

COLLEGE OF DUPAGE FOUNDATION*

The College of DuPage COVID-19 First Responder Student Relief Fund provides immediate emergency financial assistance to students currently enrolled in first responder or frontline health care programs. COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF THE FOX RIVER VALLEY AKA BLUE COURAGE

Mastering the Art of Leadership is a leadership development and training program consisting of six 8-hour heart-focused leadership courses for sergeants and lieutenants, six 4-hour mental wellness courses for 120 police academy instructors, and participant kits for CPD officers containing mental health and wellness resources.





ELGIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION

The Motorola Solutions Foundation Scholars Program awards scholarship funds to 12 female and/or minority students pursuing a degree in public safety, engineering, or technology. By eliminating financial barriers to their education, the overarching goal is to increase representation among women and minority populations in STEM and public safety courses of study, thereby fostering successful and rewarding career pathways in the sectors.

ELGIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION*

The Emergency Student Relief Fund provides financial support to ECC students affected by the coronavirus crisis. Many ECC students come from low-income families, and they or their families work in industries that have been catastrophically affected by this crisis. The Fund will help cover unexpected and urgent needs, such as technology to participate in online learning, and basic expenses like food, rent, utilities and medical bills.

FUTURE FOUNDERS FOUNDATION

The Youth Entrepreneurship Programs provide 2,025 students with technology-driven entrepreneurship programs that connect them with mentors and project-based learning opportunities. These programs help students develop an entrepreneurial mindset and build key 21st Century and STEM skills necessary for future career success.

GENESYS WORKS CHICAGO

The Computer Science and Coding program provides students with summer training and places them into paid, part-time positions with Chicago employers, providing a valuable service for an entire year. Genesys Works interns work 1,000 hours over the course of the internship. They also receive academic credit for their work, mentorship from their employer supervisor, and ongoing support from GWC staff.

GIRL SCOUTS OF GREATER CHICAGO & NORTHWEST INDIANA

The Girls Leading Community in Technology and Safety challenges girls to tackle issues on community safety, health, sustainability and renewable energy through FIRST Lego robotics participation in the fall of 2020, while earning Girl Scout badges in Robotics, Coding for Good, and Cyber security through online webinars in spring 2021.

HIGH JUMP

High Jump is a two-year, tuition-free academic enrichment and STEM education program serving motivated 7th and 8th grade students from families of limited economic means. With three campuses in Chicago, High Jump annually serves 384 middle-schoolers, offering classes created to strengthen their math and science abilities as well as develop their critical thinking, communication, and problem-solving skills, all to prepare them for high school and college success.

ILLINOIS INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY (IIT)

IIT's IPRO 2021 program exposes students to a range of user populations that can benefit from creative solutions developed through technology and engineering education and public safety challenges which will encourage youth to pursue STEM fields, and educate various age groups in public safety matters as well as address the education and training needs of first responders.





INNER-CITY COMPUTER STARS FOUNDATION

The Business, Leadership, and Technology Job Skills program prepares talented, underserved young adults to have successful technology careers and be community leaders. The program serves 60 participants in the Chicago bootcamp and 40 in the Chicago residency every year.

LOYOLA UNIVERSITY CHICAGO*

Loyola's COVID-19 Response Program supports front-line healthcare workers and provides emergency financial assistance to students. Two emergency funds -- the Loyola Medicine COVID-19 Medical Response Fund and the Loyola Student Opportunity Fund -- have been established to meet the most urgent needs, including personal protective equipment (PPE) for front-line healthcare providers, and financial assistance for students and their families experiencing financial hardship due to the pandemic.

MIDTOWN EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

MEF's Engineering Apprenticeship enables students to learn marketable and hands-on skills from professionals in engineering. Apprentices demonstrate acquired skills by producing weekly and final projects, while effective teamwork & presentation skills are integral to the program. They also develop critical thinking and decision-making skills to excel in the workplace.

MUSEUM OF SCIENCE AND INDUSTRY

The MakeCS program utilizes best practices from the museum's successful professional development and training programs to help 10-15 Chicago Public School (CPS) high school teachers and their students address computer science requirements with maker-based activities in their own space.

PROJECT EXPLORATION

The Youth-Science Pathway (YSP) strengthens students' connection to STEM learning by engaging with mentors, building STEM skills and

working with communities to create a more equitable, authentic and engaging STEM environment, in and out of school.

STEM Signing Day recognizes and celebrates 50 Chicago high school students who are pursuing a STEM field in college. Students selected to participate receive a \$1,000 scholarship as a result of their participation.

PROJECT EXPLORATION*

STEM@Home strengthens students' connection to STEM learning by maintaining a connection through virtual programs and works with communities to create equitable STEM opportunities in partnership with the Mayor's My CHI. My Future. initiative, Chicago Park Districts, Chicago STEM Pathways Cooperative, Northwestern University and DePaul University.

PROJECT SYNCERE

The E-CADEMY is a multi-year engineering program that will provide 100 underrepresented middle school and high school students with a guided pathway of opportunities to increase their interest and skills in engineering, while preparing them for entry into post-secondary engineering schools.

SHEDD AQUARIUM SOCIETY

Shedd Aquarium's Underwater Robotics program introduces approximately 300 Chicago-area teachers and students to STEM principles through the development and application of remotely operated vehicles (ROVs) to investigate aquatic environments.

SKILLS FOR CHICAGOLAND'S FUTURE

Skills collaborates with its network of community and employer partners to place 1,150 underemployed and unemployed Chicagoland individuals into jobs. In addition to achieving high placement numbers, Skills' focus is to provide quality opportunities with competitive wages, access to benefits and career paths that will increase economic mobility.





SPARKSHOP

SparkShop empowers 4th and 5th grade students to imagine their futures as engineers through site specific, immersive classroom experiences. SparkShop engages Chicago females, students of color, and underserved students where they already live and learn, no sign-up required, by delivering educational programs directly to their classrooms. SparkShop has served over 1,800 students in the greater Chicagoland area.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

The 2020 Basic Firefighter Training Academy provides financial assistance to help offset student and fire department tuition as well as expenses for the 7-week Basic Firefighter Academy.

THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF BLACK ENGINEERS

The NSBE Summer Engineering Experience for Kids (SEEK) is a national, evidence-based program proven to expose racially and ethnically underserved students to STEM fields. The program is proven to increase students' proficiency in math and science, as well as their interest in engineering.

THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO CRIME LAB

Situational Decision Making (Sit-D) is a new training for police officers to improve cognitive tools and critical thinking skills in high-stakes situations. In collaboration with the Chicago Police Department, the Crime Lab will evaluate the effectiveness of a 1,000-officer pilot, with an additional 1,000 as a comparison group.

THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO CRIME LAB*

The Chicago Crime Lab conducts analysis to help inform the Chicago Police Department and Chicago Fire Department how to most effectively safeguard the health of their front-line employees, while still ensuring public safety of the city's most vulnerable residents. The Crime Lab also provides administrative support to both agencies and assists with the procurement of personal protective equipment for first responders.

TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT 214

The Next Generation Engineers program shows students how engineers use technology to solve everyday problems while engaging students in technology courses and careers. The courses include Explorations in 21 Engineering, Robotics Systems, Green Architecture and Manufacturing Engineering.

UNIVERSIDAD POPULAR

The We Code Juntos program is a year-round, three phase computer science initiative in Chicago's South and West sides, endeavoring to help middle and high school youth view technology as a viable educational focus and career path by cultivating their computer science interests and proficiencies.


UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS AT CHICAGO (UIC) COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

UIC's Women in Engineering Summer Program (WIESP) serves rising junior and senior high school female students by introducing them to engineering and technology concepts. UIC's chapter of Girls Who Code (GWC) is a free program for Chicagoland area girls who are interested in computer science. GWC clubs serve to close the gender gap in technology by equipping girls with computing skills to pursue 21st-century opportunities.

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS GRAINGER COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING*

University of Illinois' PPE program addresses the global shortage of personal protective equipment (PPE) for healthcare workers as they combat COVID-19. The program designs, fabricates and sterilizes PPE for the local healthcare providers and the Champaign County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) for the State of Illinois. As a result of the program, a face shield design is now available via a creative commons license and face shields are being built for local hospitals.





UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS AT URBANA-CHAMPAIGN/THE HOEFT TECHNOLOGY & MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The Hoeft Technology and Management Program brings together traditional engineering and business education, providing a program where approximately 130 undergraduate students from engineering and business fields work together to develop comprehensive solutions to real-world problems.

WILLIAM RAINEY HARPER COLLEGE EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

The Engineering Pathways and Award for Excellence Scholarships increases access and exposure to STEM and public safety career pathways through scholarships awarded to underrepresented students in both fields. In partnership with the Motorola Solutions Foundation, Harper offers two scholarship programs for high achieving engineering, technology and public safety students to help overcome financial barriers to education and reward them for their achievements.

INDIANA

PURDUE UNIVERSITY WOMEN IN ENGINEERING PROGRAM

The Purdue University Women in Engineering Outreach Programs support undergraduate and graduate female engineering students and pre-service teachers in delivering outreach programs that engage and expose over 4,000 first through eighth grade students to engineering using hands-on activities in Indiana and adjacent states.

MICHIGAN

DETROIT PUBLIC SAFETY FOUNDATION*

The COVID-19 Fund supports the health of over 3,000 first responders in Detroit through the procurement of personal protective equipment,

cleaning supplies and hand sanitizer. Through ensuring Detroit police officers have adequate supplies, the Detroit Public Safety Foundation aims to slow the spread of COVID-19 amongst first responders, their families and the community at-large.

FDNY FOUNDATION

Students imagine, create, and launch original functional mobile apps that address community needs.

NPOWER INC.

NPower's Tech Fundamentals program provides technical skills training, job placement and career support programs to underprivileged people. Provided free-of-charge, the 23-week program focuses on the basic competencies, industry certifications, and access needed to secure quality, tech-based employment.

GIRLSTART

Girlstart Summer Camps are week-long STEM programs for girls entering the 4th through 8th grade. By linking a variety of STEM learning activities to a central theme, Girlstart's camps provide individualized experiences that develop a strong conceptual understanding of STEM subjects and increase participants' interest in STEM activities and careers.

MARYLAND

CODE IN THE SCHOOLS, INC.

The Prodigy Program is a job skills education and mentoring program for students in Baltimore City. Through after-school classes, summer programs, mentorship and work-based learning opportunities, they provide students with pathways from school to careers in computing fields.





DIGITAL HARBOR FOUNDATION

Digital Harbor Foundation (DHF) provides transformative technology education and career-readiness training to 1,250 Baltimore-area youth every year. Through year-round educational and employment programs, youth gain real-world experience with core principles and skills of technology and design thinking through computer science, web design and digital fabrication. DHF targets populations who are underrepresented in technology fields, namely girls, people of color, and youth from low-income backgrounds.

NAMI MARYLAND

NAMI Maryland conducts trainings to help first responders throughout Maryland, including police and emergency medical service providers, respond effectively to individuals and families experiencing mental health crises.

NAMI MARYLAND*

NAMI Maryland's COVID-19 Responder Care program offers webinars and resources to over 500 Emergency Medical Services professionals, law enforcement/public safety officers and other first responders throughout the State of Maryland to help them care for their own mental health as well as their family members. The program takes into account the extraordinary stress factors imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

AMERICAN RED CROSS

SEATTLE POLICE FOUNDATION*

The Cordico Shield App provides mental health and critical safety resources for Seattle Police Department's first responders, civilian employees and their families. Through the app, officers can refer to resources that address the prevention of contracting the virus as an officer, screening tools for determining if a citizen is at risk, the importance of self-care during this crisis, how to support your family and address their concerns, and other topics.

SEATTLE POLICE FOUNDATION

The SPD Patrol Level Law Enforcement Casualty Care (LECC) Training provides Patrol Officers with the necessary skills to render aid to victims at violent crime scenes. The four day training includes courses on basic principles of the 9-hour LECC and greatly expands officers ability to better treat penetrating trauma and prevent the death of victims of violent crimes.

TECHBRIDGE GIRLS

The ChangeMakers 2.0 program provides high-quality, gender-focused STEM programs to ensure that all girls have access to economic mobility. The program supports 45 middle school Seattle-area girls and four educators with an average of 24 hours of programming each to ensure that all girls can achieve the economic promise of a quality STEM education and prosperous STEM career.

The Junior Cadet is a signature DC Police Foundation program, and Cadet Explorers is an extension of this program targeting older

students. Both programs provide 150+ students, ages 10-20, with mentoring and exposure to careers in public safety. Middle school students who participate in the Junior Cadet program are then eligible to apply to the Cadet Explorers program.





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
