The REACH regulation creates EU chemical policy which aims at avoiding chemical impacts to human health and the environment; the Regulation entered into force on June 1, 2007. On 28 October 2008, the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) released the Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC). Additional substances have and will continue to be added on an on-going basis. REACH also has provisions to restrict substances over a period of time. Motorola Solutions monitors REACH and other regulations to assure procedures and practices are implemented to meet our obligations.
