# DOJ Student, Teachers and Officers Preventing (STOP) School Violence Program

## Program overview

The Student, Teachers, and Officers Preventing (STOP) School Violence Program is designed to improve school safety and security by providing students and teachers with the tools they need to recognize, respond quickly to and help prevent acts of violence. It supports programs that implement training, develop school threat assessment teams and/or intervention teams to identify violence risks, introduce technologies like anonymous reporting tools or apply other school safety strategies that assist in preventing violence.

## Who can apply

More information on each entity type and eligibility can be found on p. 7 of the [STOP School Violence Program Notification of Funding Opportunity \(NOFO\)](#). The following entities are eligible to apply for the STOP School Violence Program, broken down by entity type.

### Category 1

- **Government Entities:** County governments, City or township governments, Special district governments and Native American tribal governments (federally recognized only)

### Category 2

- **Educational Organizations:** Independent school districts and Private institutions of higher education
- **Nonprofit Organizations:** Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) (other than institutions of higher education), Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education)
- **Other:** Units of local government, Private K–12 schools (including private charter schools), Public charter schools

## Funding available

A total of \$83 million is anticipated to be awarded to about 79 recipients in the following categories:

- **Category 1** - 10 awards of up to \$2,000,000.
- **Category 2** - 69 awards of up to \$1,000,000.

## Deadline

An applicant's SF-424 form must be submitted first to [Grants.gov](#) by **October 27, 2025, 11:59 p.m.** Applicants are encouraged to submit the form at least 48 hours prior to the deadline. The full application, including documents such as the Abstract, Narratives, Budget, Disclosures/Assurances, etc. are to be submitted to [JustGrants](#) by **November 3, 2025, 8:59 p.m.** For more information on each application component, see pp. 15-27 of the [STOP School Violence Program Notification of Funding Opportunity \(NOFO\)](#).

## Program objectives and goals

The goals for the STOP School Violence Program are listed below. More information on programmatic goals and objectives can be found on p. 11 of the [STOP School Violence Program Notification of Funding Opportunity \(NOFO\)](#).

- **Objective 1:** Train school personnel and educate students on preventing student violence against others and themselves. This can include anti-bullying training and/or specialized training for school officials and law enforcement to respond to mental health crises.
- **Objective 2:** Increase school safety by developing and implementing threat assessment and/or intervention teams to identify school violence risks and implement strategies to mitigate those risks.
- **Objective 3:** Implement a technology solution, such as an anonymous reporting technology that can be implemented as a smartphone app, a hotline, or a website in the applicant's geographic area designed to provide a way for students, teachers, faculty, and community members to anonymously identify school violence threats, or other technology solutions that will improve school safety.

Priority consideration will be given to proposals that address the following items, but more information on priority consideration can be found on p. 10 of the [STOP School Violence Program Notification of Funding Opportunity \(NOFO\)](#).

- Directly supporting law enforcement operations (including immigration law enforcement operations);
- Combatting violent crime;
- Supporting services to American citizens;
- Protecting American children;
- Supporting American victims of trafficking and sexual assault; and
- State/local law enforcement efforts that are coordinated with federal law enforcement efforts (including immigration law enforcement efforts)

## Period of performance

The performance period for this grant, for all categories, is 36 months, starting October 1, 2025.

## Cost share

There is no cost share for this grant program.
